Pastor Dave's Ministry Minute - April 2017 "Hymns, Songs, and Spiritual Songs"

In his recently published book, "10,000 Reasons", Matt Redman writes about how great worship music comes out of moments in our lives; moments of pain and sorrow, as well as moments of joy and elation. He has written some very popular worship music over the past 20 plus years and says that when he is looking for inspiration or finds himself in need of spiritual refreshment he reads the hymns. One of his favorite hymn writers is Charles Wesley who is said to have written over 6500

hymns over the course of his life. Wesley is said to have written no less than 17 hymns in the midst of an earthquake as he describes in musical prose about the fragility of the earth and the temporal nature of our world. The hymns are of great value and need to continue to be a part of our worship services. With the advent of the contemporary worship movement in the 1960's I'm sure there were many people who thought the hymns would soon become a thing of the past but yet here we are some 50 odd years later singing hymns that have been a part of the Christian Church for hundreds of years. I have a deep appreciation for all genres of music and especially worship music, both contemporary and traditional. As I've reflected on Redman's book I am convinced that what gives any religious song staying power is the truth that is contained in its lyrics. The truth is the truth is the truth says a friend of mine. When a song speaks to the truth of God I trust it will stand the test of time.

"Speak to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit. Sing and make music from your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ." Ephesians 5:19-20

The Word on Parenting

Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it. Proverbs 22:6

Having grown up in the shadow of Washington D.C., I have been a long term reader of the Washington Post. While primarily interested in the Sports page, especially the goingson of the local teams, given the perpetual

woes of my beloved Redskins, I actually spend more time it seems on the front page, scanning the current happenings, both nationally and around the world. A year or so ago, I couldn't help but notice an article headlined..."Free Range Parenting". While somewhat familiar with the concept of free range farming, this reference to parenting was a new one. Not unlike "free range chicken" that roam and wander their days away on the farm, the parenting model is not that dissimilar. According to the article, parents in Silver Spring, MD, a community in Montgomery County that is about six miles north of Washington, allowed their two elementary aged children to walk home from a park unattend-

debate or condemnation, but as a point of awareness, as a reminder of the importance of our role as parents and grandparents, to our own children, and the younger generation around us. As believers, without the substance of Scripture and spiritual truth, what is the foundation of our kids to be based on in today's world, or in our society in general? The site of two small kids walking alone in this urban setting resulted in the police being notified by a passerby, and ultimately, in charges of neglect resulting for the children's parents. Long story short, all charges were ultimately dropped in the "free range parenting" case, amidst, according to one particular article on the matter, an outpouring of support from the masses who saw the actions of the police, etc. as an overreaction and unnecessary. "Free Range Parenting", according to its literature, is a method of parenting counter to the "helicopter", over-indulgent, microscopic care of obsessive parents, which is viewed as limiting, unimaginative, and a potential hindrance to the growth and development of children, according to Free Range advocates. I highlight this topic not as an opportunity for

'Are We There Yet?'







The beginning of March saw the Junior High MYF blast off for *Planet* Wisdom!

"Where is that?" you may ask.

It is not a where, but a what. Planet Wisdom is a two-day regional conference that's designed to challenge middle school and high school students to dig deeper into the Bible and see their world from God's perspective. Since 2001 Planet Wisdom has been impacting the lives of teens across the country. The event is put together by Youth Specialties, one of the foremost youth ministry organizations in the country. Planet Wisdom takes place every year in various cities around the country. One of those cities, and the closest to us, is Washington, DC.

Planet Wisdom features a worship

band, nationally known speakers, and a comedy sketch team.

This year's theme was fear. Fears – we all have them. We've all felt it. We all know what it's like. So the question isn't: "How can I never be afraid again?" because that's not how life works. The question is: "Are you ready to name and face your fears?"

The six sessions dealt with topics such as recognizing our fears, coping with

our fears, sharing our fears, and the "fear of the Lord". The teaching was led by Heather Flies, who is recognized as one of the top (if not the top) junior high youth leaders in the country. The band For All Seasons led worship at each session. The Slap Happy Comedy Team provided the laughs.

The Junior High youth who went came back gushing about the event and are pushing to go again next year.

Sticky Faith: Busy, Busy, Busy!

I recently read that the University of Phoenix conducted a poll that found that the average teen has 3.5 hours of homework a night. That is on top of the 7 hours a day that a student is in school. That's 10.5 hours a day. That's crazy! Add to this sport practices and fine art troupes, Boy Scouts and after school jobs, friends and hobbies...and perhaps it is a wonder if we ever see any youth at the church. Sometimes I feel frustrated, when week after week youth are forced to choose between participating in our church ministries or all the fore-mentioned activities. So what can we do?

For me, I will try to be more understanding. I know how expensive college has become. I know that car insurance is expensive. Thus, the need for part time jobs, advanced courses, and sports and academic scholarships. I also know the need for some downtime to let off some stress. Even though I may feel frustrated when youth do not take part in our ministries due to homework, sports, or other reasons, I will be there waiting for them when they can come. I will also continue to create events during winter and spring breaks and during the summer when there is more time available.

Is 10.5 hours a day on average really being spent on school work? If this sounds like your child, perhaps it is time to contact the teacher, school or a school board member to ask for a homework policy that limits the amount.

Parents, help teach your youth time management. Model setting goals, being on time and working in a logical progression. Work together to set up a schedule for projects and avoid doing most or all of it at the last minute.

Consider limiting how many extra curricula activities you are involved in. Try to have a little bit of downtime.

Finally, prioritize. Is God really of utmost importance in your life? Then demonstrate it. Youth, spend less time playing that favorite video game or watching your favorite movie for the umpteenth time and instead join us for youth group, a service project, or Synago. Parents, remember that you are generally still the most influential people in your child's life. Model for them regular worship, study, and service to others. What you say and do does leave its mark on your children. You know that old saying, "The apple doesn't fall far from the tree."

In conclusion, life today seems to move at a faster pace than ever. This is true for both parents and children. This causes stress and makes it difficult to find the time for being in relationship with the Lord. I want you to know I understand, and will be thrilled whenever I see the youth at any of our ministry events. However, I urge you to try to prioritize your relationship with God. After all, that relationship is of eternal value.

World Vision's Global 6K for Water is on May 6th. Join the Wyoming United Methodist Water Walkers to provide clean water for children who walk 6 km (=3.72 miles) to get water each day.

When we go to our kitchen faucets for a cold glass of sparkling clear water, do we ever think of those who do not have such a luxury? We take clean water for granted in the USA. In many parts of the world, women and children must walk an average of 3.72 miles or 6 kilometers each day to bring back polluted water for their families. There is no such thing as clean water in many villages in Africa.

That is why Wyoming UMC has decided to help in the effort to bring clean water to those families by taking part in **World**

Vision's Global 6K for Water on May 6th at 2:30 p.m. We will be departing from the church and following a route that equals the distance that those less fortunate must travel to carry water to their homes.

To register, please go to <u>www.wyomingumc.com</u> and click on the link for **Global 6K for Water**. There you will be able to register to walk with our team. The cost is \$50 to register and \$25 for children under age 15. Once you have registered, you will receive a T-shirt and a bib to wear with the picture of a World Vision child which you are sponsoring in the 6K walk.

Your Help and Presence is Needed

Maundy Thursday is the night three days before Easter when we remember the Last Supper of Jesus and his disciples. They met in the upper room to eat a traditional Passover meal which included bread and wine and various foods including several vegetables that symbolized the many saving acts of God in the lives of the Hebrew people. On this last night together, Jesus added words to the traditional prayers that changed the meaning of their fellowship meal forever.

Two thousand years later, every communion Sunday, we still say those words and eat that meal that for Christians is our



remembrance of Christ's saving sacrifice for us and our celebration of Christ's triumph over sin and death.



This year, on **April 13 at 6:00 p.m.**, three days before Easter, we too will meet in the "upper room" of our church (the Family Life Center) and enjoy a meal together, a meal of soup, bread, butter and grape juice. During our hour together, we will hear the familiar story of Christ's last night amongst us in word and music, and we will share in a very special communion service together.

Looking back... Delaware State News, Easter Sunday, 2016

DOVER — "Lilies are absolutely to die for." Longwood Gardens horticulturist Karl Gercens is not the first person to trumpet the fragrant beauty of Lilium. Nearly 2,000 years ago Jesus told his disciples to "Consider how the lilies grow. They do not labor or spin. Yet I tell you, not even Solomon in all his splendor was dressed like one of these." (Luke 12:27) ...

... The pastor of Wyoming United Methodist Church, sees the lily as a symbol of resurrection, and specifically the resurrection of Jesus Christ. "The lily bulb is underground,... like in a grave, until it emerges from the darkness of winter to form flowers and bloom at Easter. While the flowers shout rebirth, the color symbolizes purity." - "In the book of Revelation, white robes are associated with eternal life, the pureness of Jesus, his sinlessness,"... "his willingness to sacrifice his life for us."

Today Wyoming Church, like many others, will be bursting with the white lilies as Christians celebrate Easter. It's a tradition born in the last century when Americans embraced the Easter lily, native to southern Japan's Ryukyu Islands. ... At Wyoming United Methodist Church on Wyoming Mill Road in West Dover, the placement of Easter lilies in the sanctuary has a long history. ... Congregants bought the flowers used today and will take them home after the service. While some will grace homes, others will be placed on graves or taken to nursing homes.
